### **FLU SEASON**

Flu vaccination is important because, while flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life threatening for some people, particularly those with certain health conditions. The best time to have your flu vaccine is in the autumn or early winter before flu starts spreading. Some people are more vulnerable to the effects of cold weather. This includes:

- people aged 65 and older babies and children under the age of 5
- people on a low income (so cannot afford heating)
- people who have a long-term health condition
- people with a disability
- pregnant women
- people who have a mental health condition Flu vaccines are very safe. All adult flu vaccines are given by injection into the muscle of the upper arm. Most side effects are mild and only last for a day or so, such as:
- -a slightly raised temperature
- -muscle aches
- -sore arm where the needle went in Try these tips to help reduce the discomfort:
  - · continue to move your arm regularly
- take a painkiller, such as paracetamol or ibuprofen some people, including those who are pregnant, should not take ibuprofen unless a doctor recommends it.

#### CANCER ALLIANCE-KNOW THE SIGNS

Don't carry the worry of cancer with you. If something in your body doesn't feel right, speak to your GP Practice. Know the signs and keep a diary of your symptoms. This will help when you speak to a medical professional.

- -A new lump/bump that wasn't there before.
- Sudden, unexplained weight loss
- -Blood in your poo or your urine
- -Feeling tired all the time
- -Breathlessness
- -Bloating/swelling
- -Changes to your skin.

9 times out of ten, your symptoms will not mean you have cancer, but it is better to know as early as possible so you can rule out cancer or get the treatment you need, quickly.

## **BE TICK AWARE**

With the cooler, autumn weather, the risk of ticks bites peak, late summer early autumn is the worst time of year for tick infestations. Lyme disease is a bacterial infection that can be spread to humans by infected ticks. It's usually easier to treat if it's diagnosed early. Symptoms of Lyme disease-

 A circular or oval shape rash around a tick bite can be an early symptom of Lyme disease in some people, although not everyone will experience this.

Some people also get flu-like symptoms a few days or weeks after they were bitten by an infected tick, such as:

- a high temperature, or feeling hot and shivery
- headache
- muscle and joint pain
- tiredness and loss of energy

Ask for an urgent GP appointment or get help from NHS 111 if:

- you've been bitten by a tick or visited an area in the past 3 months where infected ticks could be, and you either:
- feel unwell with flu-like symptoms such as feeling hot and shivery, headaches or aching muscles
- have a round or oval shape rash
- Tell them if you have recently been in forests or grassy ar


#### DOROTHY HOUSE MIDNIGHT WALK
