# Have you checked your blood pressure recently?

High blood pressure (hypertension) is very common. Although it doesn't often come with symptoms, knowing you have high blood pressure could prevent life-threatening complications like heart attack and stroke. We have a machine in the waiting room which you are able to use at any time.

Ask reception for a token and then hand back the slip of paper with the readings, this will allow us to update your record.

# **RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS (RSV)**

RSV infections are very common. They're not usually serious, but some adults have a higher risk of getting seriously ill, particularly:

- adults over 75 years
- Adults with a weakened immune system, or long-term lung or heart conditions

RSV can also cause a serious lung infection (pneumonia) in babies and older adults.

The RSV vaccine is recommended if you're aged 75 to 79. The vaccine helps reduce the risk of RSV causing serious problems such as pneumonia.

If you're aged 75 to 79, contact your GP surgery and book an appointment.

## **Hay fever**

Hay fever is a common allergy that causes sneezing, coughing and itchy eyes. You cannot cure it, but there are things you can do to help your symptoms, or medicines you can take to help. Symptoms of hay fever include:

- sneezing and coughing
- a runny or blocked nose
- itchy, red or watery eyes
- itchy throat, mouth, nose and ears
- loss of smell
- feeling tired
- headache
- pain around the sides of your head and your forehead


Symptoms are usually worse between late March and September, especially when it's warm, humid and windy. This is when the pollen count is at its highest.

Speak to a pharmacist if you have hay fever. They can give you advice and suggest the best treatments to help with symptoms, such as:

- antihistamine drops, tablets or nasal sprays
- · steroid nasal sprays

#### See a GP if:

- · your symptoms are getting worse
- your symptoms do not improve after taking medicines from the pharmacy
- The antihistamines make you drowsy


